(translated: Hello to all of you.)

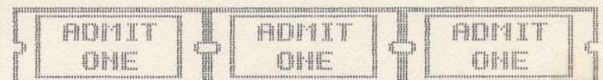
We thought you would like to be greeted for Christmas in our new Native tongue: Texian.
